Minutes of the meeting held on March 22, 2016 Prepared by Dora Parks, Committee Secretary

CALL TO ORDER AND INTRODUCTIONS

Chairman Kevin Woolbright called the regular monthly meeting to order at 9:30 am followed by the customary introductions. There were (30) committee members present.

The minutes of February 23, 2016 were approved as written.

OLD BUSINESS

None reported.

OPEN DISCUSSIONS REGARDING DAMAGE PREVENTION AWARENESS & COOPERATION

Cal Brooks (Howard County) stated during the past two months tickets were either not marked or partially marked causing delays in the County performing their work. The locators asked Cal to provide ticket numbers so they could review the tickets.

Rick Adams (Scott A. Duncan) discussed two issues;

- 1. Regarding discrepancy notices, changing an original clear code to a marked code for the relocate. Dora Parks (Miss Utility) stated this issue was recently corrected.
- 2. A utility company continues to use the clear/no conflict Ticket Check code on Update tickets that previously had a discrepancy notice processed and the relocate resulted in a marked code. Rick stated the system is no longer a 'one-call system' but a two call system. He added, work is being held up, update tickets are being processed as a result of not having enough time to complete the work within the law 12 days due to multiple processes being required to get a locate. Dora Parks stated she will contact the member to see if they can flag these types of tickets to avoid locate delays.

Tim Kaptein (Comer Construction) stated utility locators are saying they cannot access the attachments. Dora Parks explained the attachments are not automatically delivered with a copy of the ticket, the locator must use the URL provided on the ticket to view the attachments, this requires internet access.

NEW BUSINESS

Kevin Woolbright (Chaieman) announced that Jim Barron (Executive Director, MD Authority) was awarded the HALL OF FAME award during the March 2016 Common Ground Alliance (CGA) conference in Las Vegas. This award exemplifies a person who has had a national impact regarding damage prevention and safety. Jim explained that his interest in safety was sparked by an incident in 1996, when Jim's son nearly lost his life on a construction work site, at that moment Jim decided he wanted to part of the underground damage prevention solution. In the early 1990's our nation of utility owners, excavators and call centers congregated to create 'best practices' to be adopted by all stakeholders for excavation and demolition work; 160 original folks participated in this charge. In the year 2000, Common Ground Alliance was born and Jim Barron was the first board chairman. Jim remains

active in CGA and the various committees that continue to examine the issues and challenges of underground utility plant while seeking solutions that affect public safety, the environment, property and underground utilities. CGA has honored Jim with yet another award, "The Jim Barron" award given to individuals who pattern safety just as Jim has. We all congratulate our local hero of damage prevention and safety and congratulate Jim in a job so well done over the years continuing to generations to follow.

PRESENTATION, TRAINING AND EDUCATION

Jim Carroll (MD Dept. of the Environment) provided a power point presentation on "Land Use Controls at Hazardous Substance Cleanup Sites".

- Maryland's Hazardous Substance Cleanup Programs include:
 - Controlled Hazardous Substance (CHS) Enforcement Program
 - Established to carry out the CHS Response Plan (COMAR 26.14) and the CHS Act (§§7-201 266 of the Environment Article)
 - Voluntary Cleanup Program
 - Established in 1997 to encourage redevelopment of brownfield sites (§§7-501 516 of the Environment Article)
- For Human Health Risks, Maryland evaluates whether hazardous substances pose unacceptable lifetime human health risks (Chronic Risk)
 - MDE Evaluates Risks at 1 x 10-5 for Carcinogens and HQ = 1 for Non-Carcinogens;
 - Risks are calculated for users at properties.
 - Example: Industrial Properties Risks calculated for adult workers or youth trespassers
 - Exposure at Levels is Theoretical Risk
 - OSHA Evaluates for Acute Risk
- "Universe" of LRP Sites
 - Brownfield Master Inventory Sites:
 - Active 1,003 sites
 - Archived 986 sites
 - List includes sites in Voluntary Cleanup Program, CHS Enforcement, Federal Facilities, federal Superfund, and sites subject to other regulatory programs' oversight.
- LRP Sites with LUCs
 - 707 Sites with LUCs (or 5,784.912 acres subject to one or more LUCs)
- Types of LUCs
 - Groundwater Use Restriction: Groundwater use on the property is prohibited due to presence of hazardous contaminants.
 - Groundwater Encountered During Excavation Requirements: If groundwater is encountered during excavation, groundwater must be containerized and testing prior to discharge. Also must have HASP to address risks to workers.

- Excavation Notification Restriction: MDE must be notified at least 30 days in advance of excavation activities on a property.
- Paving Maintenance Required: All paving on a property must be properly maintained. Checklist must be filled out by property owner/operator.
- Slab Maintenance Required: All slabs on a property must be properly maintained. Checklist must be filled out by property owner/operator.
- Excavated Material Disposal Requirement: All excavated materials must be tested and properly disposed of at a site.
- MDE and Miss Utility
 - VCP Participants Required to Send NFRDs/COCs to Miss Utility [§7-506(i)(3)(i) and §7-514(d)(3) (i)]
 - VCP Statute Requires Participants to Become Member of One-Call System
 - Up to 366 VCP Participants May Not Have Become "Owner-Member" in One-Call System.

Jim accepted questions from the committee, the group agreed the information provided was valuable. Jim stated that in keeping with the intent of safety to the public, environment and property the MD Department of the Environment intends to become a member of the one-call system in the future.

The committee has been meeting over 2 years working on the Title 34 rewrite draft (55 meetings) Highlights of the rewrite include;

- 18 inch no dig zone
- 3 hour response to locate discrepancies
- 3 hour response to emergency tickets
- Ticket life, 12 business days
- Designer notice
- Enforcement creation of an Authority
- Cross bore, test pit the facilities when within five feet of marked facilities that will be crossed

MARYLAND UNDERGROUND FACILITIES DAMAGE PREVENTION AUTHORITY

Tom Hastings (OCC Locating Services)-Chairman and Jim Barron, Executive Director

Mr. Barron reported on the following;

March 2, 2016 meeting; new members James DiPietro (AA Co DPW, MACo) and Charles McCadden, (BGE, Subscribers) were seated.

New NPV's currently under investigation

Oral Arguments for NPV# 283 on the Constitutionality of the Authority were heard in front of the Maryland Court of Appeals, the highest court in Maryland on January 8, 2016. Waiting for an opinion.

NPV's 1216, 1834, 1841 and 1853 were scheduled for Oral Arguments in front of the Circuit Court of Anne Arundel County on April 11, 2015; however, a stay has been requested with no date set.

The Authority is sponsoring legislation in 2016 to add \$0.05 to all outgoing tickets (excluding MACo & MML) to fund the Authority. SB 480 had hearings on 2/16/16 and HB 696 had hearings on 2/18/16. Both passed committee and the floor votes of the Senate and House. Both cross-filed pending hearings in the respective committees.

To Date:

The Authority has received 169 NPV's representing 290 separate violation of Title 12. The Authority has recommended \$305,500 in fines, levied \$168,000 in actual fines and collected \$112,100 in fines.

The Authority has scheduled a meeting for April 6th at 9:00am, meetings and hearings are open to the public.
