Minutes of the meeting for November 27, 2018 Meeting hosted by Miss Utility in Hanover, MD Prepared by Susan Sullivan and Dora Parks

CALL TO ORDER AND INTRODUCTIONS

Chairman Kevin Woolbright (WSSC) called the regular monthly meeting to order at 9:34 a.m. followed by the customary self-introductions.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

OLD BUSINESS

Reminder; the mobile app MISS UTILITY is available on iTunes and Google Play providing access to ITIC, Search & Status, Ticket Check, resources and the Miss Utility website.

Miss Utility is creating a new website that will launch in January 2019. The website will provide new features; an interactive calendar that provides event explanation and details and an event banner on the home page. Information has been organized for user ease, colors are pleasing to the eye, much of the information has been updated and an easy to navigate portal for all aspects of damage prevention and stake holder information. ITIC and Search and Status take center stage on each user's page.

OPEN DISCUSSIONS REGARDING DAMAGE PREVENTION AWARENESS & COOPERATION

The committee discussed the following matters;

Kevin Woolbright (WSSC) complimented Tamara Neal (Washington Gas) who took the time to receive a call, handle an emergency issue and dispatch help, all from home during time off from Thanksgiving. Just another example of the impact open communication between committee members has on the safety within our local communities.

Will Gooch (Decisive Communications) spoke about locating concerns with Verizon; many attendees joined the discussion of tickets where Verizon was not being notified or receiving an email from Verizon within minutes of ticket processing with a clear/no conflict positive response. Dora Parks (OCC/Miss Utility) provided a statement regarding work site locate issues and the importance of reporting. As with any locating concern, it was emphasized that proper procedures are in place when locate discrepancies arise. If a contractor believes there are facilities located within an excavation area, but the facility statuses a ticket "Clear-No Conflict" it is the responsibility of the contractor to stop excavation and file a discrepancy via Search and Status. In Maryland, if a person believes that Title 12 has been violated, they have the option to file a complaint with Maryland Underground Facility Damage Prevention Authority (MUFDPA), www.mddpa.org.

Lisa Hurley (SMECO) ask about "Clear Evidence" distance rules; is a marker located a mile down the road 'clear evidence' of a utility in her excavation area? Jim Barron (MD Authority) responded by saying that a specific

distance is not clearly defined by the law, only that it should be reasonable. He also stated that new language included in the Title 12 rewrite strengthens the definition of clear evidence. Dora Parks provided Title 12, section 12-126 (a)

\$12–126.

- (a) An owner-member shall mark its underground facility if the owner-member has determined that a proposed excavation or demolition:
 - (1) is within 5 feet of the horizontal plane of the underground facility; or
- (2) because of planned blasting, is so near to the underground facility that the underground facility may be damaged or disturbed.

Sherry Torillo (RB Hinkle), regarding new construction, Verizon auto-clearing issues.

Update tickets going from marked to clear/no conflict in Baltimore City, Joe Feronti (USIC) will meet with the contractor.

Dora Parks conveyed kudos to Byung Kim (UtiliQuest) for helping to resolve Verizon issues with Becky Mellinger (Child's Landscaping,) emphasizing the importance of communication between stakeholders. Becky Mellinger again shared her concerns about Verizon's clearinghouse procedures.

Rodrigo Delcid (DCI) shared his concern regarding an overload of DC emergency tickets; stating some of the tickets were verified as non-emergency work. Rodrigo asked if the call center regulated emergency ticket processing. Matt Ruddo (OCC) explained that the contractor agrees to the necessity of the emergency; to prevent danger to life, health, or property, CSRs have no way of knowing the validity of an emergency work site condition. Dora Parks stated she would contact the excavator to review the terms of emergency ticket processing and the impact on locators. Delcid will provide ticket numbers.

NEW BUSINESS

Dora Parks introduced the <u>Jobsite Juniors</u> magazine and shared the "Touch-a-Truck" article that she submitted and subsequently made it into the nationally distributed magazine. She is also prompting the magazine to include excavation and work site photographs that include properly marked facilities in order to encourage the proper use of 811 which in turn promotes safe digging.

Save the date, the 5th annual Touch A Truck event will be held on Saturday, August 3rd at the Bowie Baysox Stadium. In 2018, over (40) construction vehicles and trucks were displayed with lots of added activities for this homeowner outreach. Dora Parks introduced her newly created 'kids' color code card using UTILITY HEROS and invited the meeting attendees to help give each hero a name. All contributing participants will receive a thank you gift that was the hit of the 2018 Touch A Truck event at the January 22, 2019 meeting.

Dora also reminded committee members of the upcoming holidays that will have an impact on response due dates/time and ticket expiration; December 25th and January 1st.

SAFETY PRESENTATION

Presented by Dominic Pope, Gaines and Company, Director of Safety

As the 2018 Dig Smart Honorable Mention Award recipient, Dominic provided a PPT outlining Gaines and Company's approach to the work site safety initiatives that they believe won their company this prestigious recognition. Gaines and Company was founded in 1954 with over 400 employees in the Maryland and North Carolina divisions.

Gaines and Company promotes a culture of safety each day on each work site with these key elements:

- Communications key to every job
- White Lining
- Site planning
- Review of safety concerns (traffic controls)
- Site meets
- Provide site plans
- Ticket processing follow through on Ticket Check and marking
- Knowing the law and training employees on their responsibilities under the law
- Verbal confirmation each day on each work site; NO damages, vehicle accidents, injuries, death

Dominic stated the award of attending the 2018 Greater Chesapeake Damage Prevention Training Conference was an extraordinary experience and benefit not only for Dominic but for Gaines as a company and he thanked the committee for their support of excavators in Maryland and DC.
