Minutes of the meeting for April 23, 2019 Meeting hosted by Miss Utility in Hanover, MD Prepared by Susan Sullivan

CALL TO ORDER AND INTRODUCTIONS

Chairman Kevin Woolbright called the regular monthly meeting to order at 9:36 a.m. followed by the customary self-introductions.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

OLD BUSINESS

CGA Conference Update reported by Dora Parks (OCC); This year's conference was held March 26-28th in Tampa, FL. There were 1,800 people in attendance representing a variety of industry stakeholders from around the country. There were multiple industry-specific committee meetings and breakout sessions. Mike Abrashoff, Former Commander of the USS Benfold and author of <u>It's Your Ship</u> was the keynote speaker. In addition, were two conference highlights:

- The presentation of the Jim Barron Award. Jim Barron (MD Authority) of Ronkin Construction played a key role in the *Common Ground Study* and went on to serve as the first president of the CGA. Jim has and continues to show true dedication to the CGA and to several other damage prevention organizations and projects. The Barron award is given to an individual(s) or organization(s) that have shown true dedication to efforts that enhance underground damage prevention.
- The 2019 Hall of Fame Award was presented by Jim Barron to OCC CEO, Tom Hoff. The Hall of Fame Award maintains an ongoing roster of damage prevention champions. The award honors CGA members that have served in the organization over a long period of time and whose impact has left its mark on the organization in a positive and memorable way.

CGA Best Practices Committee Update reported by Scott Brown (Committee Co-Chair); This committee's objective is to ensure best practices remain the definitive guide for underground safety and damage prevention through continued identification and publication of consensus-based practices. After a 5-year collaborative effort, the committee adopted a new Cross-Bore Best Practice. This new practice will be included in the 2020 CGA's Best Practice Guide. Maryland has become a model for *Call Before You Clear* practices which were developed to prevent cross-boring.

Next year's CGA Event will be held March 24-26, 2020 in Palm Springs, California.

NEW BUSINESS

Miss Utility Web Site Update reported by Dora Parks; The new Miss Utility website cutover on January 25, 2019. While minor updates and changes are still occurring, user feedback has been overwhelmingly positive. Please contact Dora Parks with any ideas that continue to improve user efficacy.

Scott Brown (WGL) spoke about the Gold Shovel Standard which is a nonprofit organization committed to improving workforce and public safety and the integrity of buried infrastructure. These necessary improvements are best identified when data is shared among stake holders. To this end, Scott spoke about the importance of facility owner members reporting damages so that data analysis is better able to identify root cause which can then direct damage prevention awareness, education and training. He then shared a case in point:

• At a recent meeting Scott attended, a home owner asked about damages. It was stated that many facility damages are caused when homeowners fail to call 811 before building fences designed to keep new pets in the yard. Greg Mason (WGL) came up with the idea to leave the 811 message on doggy clean-up bags at local vet offices as a reminder for new pet owners to Call Before Digging new fencing. It was then decided the message be put on pet food can-covers as well.

OPEN DISCUSSIONS REGARDING DAMAGE PREVENTION AWARENESS & COOPERATION

Mitzi Ambush (PEPCO) opened up the discussion by speaking about an increase in damages to facilities encased in concrete especially in Washington, D.C. at street crossings and intersections. She noted that most often, excavators hit the encasements while saw-cutting. She asked that contractors educate excavators to recognize encasement infrastructure so facility damage can be avoided. Mitzi can be contacted for those interested in photo examples.

Dora Parks stated the importance of having working relationships within the damage prevention community and thanked Ferguson Trenching for recently assisting a locator who was having difficulty locating two 12-inch water lines.

Jim Barron (MD Authority) spoke about a recent event detailing the value of using paint to locate underground facilities over using just flags. Flags can be prematurely removed or relocated by unsuspecting passersby which can cause miscommunication between the contract locate and the excavator. No harm was done during this event but the likelihood of harm to people and damage to facilities increases when paint is not used and flags are not left in the correct location.

David Ball (Howard Co DPW) asked how long ITIC polygons have been in use and why people were still using grids to denote potential dig area. It was stated that polygons have been in use since August 2017 and that people were still using grids because the user may be uncomfortable with drawing a polygon, i.e., office secretary.

Mitzi Ambush ended open discussion by suggesting that contract flaggers be reminded by facility owner members of their duties in protecting not only workers and facilities but pedestrians as well. It was stated that often their list of duties depends on contract stipulations and state law.

SAFETY PRESENTATION

Susan Sullivan (Miss Utility) introduced and played a video titled: <u>Active Shooter Prevention Training with OSHA</u> <u>Message</u>. Chris Grollnek, the nation's leading expert on the phenomenon of Active Shooter and Active Shooter Prevention is dedicated to the survival of potential victims who are not first responders, but actually first on scene as potential victims. In other words, those most immediately involved in these vicious incidents. Along with Active Shooter Prevention Experts this video was created to give an overview of the 3 suggested steps to best survive an active shooter event: react, escape, survive.
