Minutes of the meeting for October 27, 2020 Zoom Meeting hosted by Miss Utility in Hanover, MD Prepared by Susan Sullivan

CALL TO ORDER AND INTRODUCTIONS

Chairman Kevin Woolbright called the regular monthly meeting to order at 9:33 a.m. via Zoom. There were 43 zoom attendees.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of September 22, 2020 were reviewed by the committee; Dora Parks (Miss Utility) made a motion to accept the minutes as presented, Mark Hamrick (Verizon) seconded the motion, the motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Dora Parks (Miss Utility) shared that on September 30th, the call center updated their base map layer which improves locating and mapping capabilities required when processing tickets online. Contractors working in developing communities are encouraged to share mapping/design plans that, when confirmed, can be added to the call center base map in real time. - ITIC 2.0 will run in tandem with ITICnxt moving forward. However, it will eventually be removed and ITICnxt will be the sole ticketing platform.

ITICNXT DEMONSTRATION

- New iSITE log in page featuring Forgot Username/Password and Register links.
- Access to and location of Search and Status links.
- Access to and location of a user's current ITIC 2.0 menu now linked under the icon dubbed Legacy Application.

- New batching feature which allows users to update, correct or cancel multiple tickets at a time.
- Introduction of a mapping session including an overview of processing procedures, mapping tools, auto-fill ticket fields, job profiles and business rule/ticket splitting features.

OPEN DISCUSSION

Becky Mellinger (Childs Landscape) recognized and gratefully acknowledged the assistance of Daniel Robinette (USIC), Tony Umstead (USIC), George Daffan (UtiliQuest) and Erik Phillips (UtiliQuest) for their help in facilitating the location of 2 recent and very extensive landscaping projects.

Debora Harvey (NUCA) thanked Miss Utility and WGL for their sponsorship, support, and participation in a recent golf tournament where the Miss Utility team won 3rd place and Kevin Woolbright won Closest to the Pin. She also provided a DC Damage Enforcement Law update.

MARYLAND AUTHORITY Reported by Jim Barron (Executive Director)

- Due to COVID 19 Restrictions, the Authority Office remains closed. Employees continue working from home and anticipate continuing monthly meetings on ZOOM through the end of 2020.
- An Authority Meeting was held October 7 via Zoom.
 - o Eight NPV's were reviewed.
 - o Seven were assessed fines and damage prevention training or policy letters.
 - One will be closed due to insufficient evidence.
 - o A warning letter request, related to an incident in Montgomery County, was denied.
- The next Authority Meeting is scheduled for November 4 via Zoom. It will be a Closed Executive Session. A discussion concerning the \$200 NPV filing fee is planned.
- The Authority is considering four open business meetings a year, one each quarter- as required by statute. Remaining meetings will be reserved for Formal Hearings and Closed Executive Sessions.
- Conducting Formal Hearings on Zoom is under considered.

MARYLAND TITLE 12 RE-WRITE Reported by Jim Barron (Executive Director)

- Governor Hogan vetoed SB0877 on May 7, 2020.
- The Md Authority plans on meeting with the sponsors and key legislators in the late fall regarding a veto override for the January 2021 legislative session.
- To be successful, it takes a Super Majority (three-fifths vote of the elected membership) in both the Senate and the House to override the Governor's Veto.
- If the override is successful, SB0877 will become law 30 days after the formal vote in the Senate and House.

If the override is unsuccessful, the bill will be re-introduced during the 2021 legislative session SB0877 and other legislative documents can be downloaded from the Authority Website by visiting https://mddpa.org and clicking on Resources.

 - 27.48% due to no call or valid ticket
 - 36.55% due to hitting a marked line
 - 28.20% due to incorrect locate marks
 - 7.77% due to other root causes
